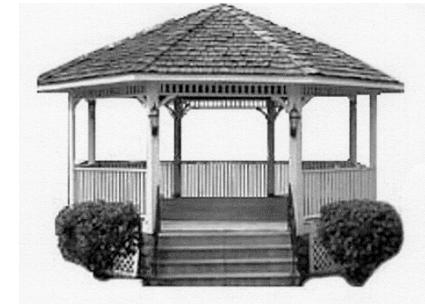

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the North Royalton Office on Aging/Human Services, from its inception in April of 1978, has been to provide senior residents, age 55 and over, with community based services and referrals to supportive agencies. It is our goal to provide support when needed, in a user friendly manner, offering security and peace of mind whenever possible.

Since knowledge should be shared and since many government programs for the elderly are also available to younger, disabled or disadvantaged persons, it has been the desire of the Office on Aging/Human Services and the Administrative and Legislative bodies of the City of North Royalton to include all residents who have need and seek help with these programs. This goal has been reached through the offering of assistance as noted in our summary of services.

It is our continuing goal to provide services to the best of our ability while respecting the needs of others to receive these services with dignity and the right to confidentiality as best serves their needs.

The North Royalton Office on Aging/Human Services offers many programs for Senior Citizens and will assist individuals in completing paperwork for governmental programs. We offer assistance in arranging home health aides, Meals on Wheels and utility disconnections. We will help you coordinate your Medicare, Co-Insurance and Medicare Part D. We have a referral service for many State and County programs, which includes HEAP, E-HEAP and Homestead Exemption.

Our RSVP (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) volunteers are active in all walks of life. Some of the areas they contribute to are the Ohio Reads Program, make chemo caps, butterfly pillows, lap robes and hospice blankets for area hospitals, nursing homes and cancer centers.

Along with the North Royalton Kiwanis Club we offer a Holiday Basket Program and an Emergency Food Bank.

We are part of/or volunteer for the Parma Hospital Senior Network Members, Salvation Army, American Red Cross, Relay for Life Members and CERT. When necessary, we work with our local Safety Forces and hospitals regarding elderly needs.
