## AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF BP PRODUCTS NORTH AMERICA, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF FUEL FOR THE 2007 SEASON AS THE LOWEST AND BEST BID, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton may purchase fuel through its membership in the Joint Municipal Improvement Consortium at a lower rate than if purchased on the open market; and

WHEREAS: The bids submitted to the Joint Municipal Improvement Consortium were consistent with the competitive bidding requirements of the Ohio Revised Code and Charter of the City of North Royalton.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON,  
COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The bid of BP Products North America, Inc. through the Joint Municipal Improvement Consortium for fuel for the City of North Royalton for No Lead Regular Gasoline (transport and tankwagon) and for Ultra Low Sulfur Diesel (transport and tankwagon) as set forth in Exhibit A, in accordance with the specifications on file in the office of the Service Director is hereby accepted as the lowest and best bid.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract on behalf of the City of North Royalton with BP Products North America, Inc., as set forth in Section 1 hereof, said contract to be in such form as is approved by the Director of Law.

Section 3. The Service Director is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to BP Products North America, Inc.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall supersede all previously adopted ordinances in direct conflict herewith.

Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 6. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for the purchase of fuel.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
