ORDINANCE NO. 07-30

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 880 EARNED INCOME TAX, SECTION 880.27
DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS, OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTH
ROYALTON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: Financial considerations for the municipality require a change in which way income tax funds are disbursed to various funds; and

WHEREAS: It is necessary to amend Section 880.27 Disbursement of Funds of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Royalton; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to provide for this amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON,
COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Chapter 880 of the Codified Ordinances entitled Earned Income Tax, Section 880.27 Disbursement of Funds (b) (2) is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Income tax funds available shall be disbursed in the following manner:

S C M & R Fund	\$385,000 \$215,000 per year
Office on Aging Fund	\$165,000 per year
City Income Tax Fund	6.00% of collections
Police Facility Operating Fund	\$180,000 per year
General Fund	Balance Remaining

Section 2. Chapter 880 of the Codified ordinances entitled Earned Income Tax, Section 880.27 Disbursement of Funds (c) (2) remains as follows:

(2) Income tax funds available shall be disbursed in the following manner:

- (i) 30% of the collections shall be placed in the General Fund;
- (ii) 45% of the collections shall be placed in the SCM & R Fund; and
- (iii) 25% of the collections shall be placed in the Stormwater and Drainage Fund.

Section 3. All other provisions of Section 880.27, Disbursement of funds, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Royalton shall remain in full force and effect. The disbursement of funds shall be in effect as of January 1, 2007.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall supersede all previously adopted Ordinances in direct conflict herewith.

Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 6. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for a change in the disbursement of funds.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
