## A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY ISSUE 127

- WHEREAS: 47 communities throughout Cuyahoga County depend on our county library system which is ranked Number 1 in the nation; and
- WHEREAS: In November, voters will decide on a crucial issue that will protect our Library's future; and
- WHEREAS: Issue 127 is the Library's only local operating support and accounts for nearly half its annual operating budget; and
- WHEREAS: Issue 127 is endorsed by the county's elected officials, business leaders, organized labor and many others; and
- WHEREAS: Issue 127 will provide critical resources to keep our County Library strong, up-to-date and an asset to our community; and
- WHEREAS: Without Issue 127, our community will lose; books will be depleted, programs will have to be cut, technology will become outdated and our buildings will deteriorate as usage continues to increase; and
- WHEREAS: This replacement of 2 mills and addition of a half mill adds just \$1.76 per month to a \$100,000 property, the lowest millage of any library in the county and will protect the future of Cuyahoga County Public Library.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Council of the City of North Royalton and Mayor Robert A. Stefanik hereby declare their support of Issue 127 for the Cuyahoga County Public Library's replacement levy of 2 mills and the addition of a half mill, and encourages all residents of the City of North Royalton to vote "Yes" on November 4, 2008, to protect the future of the Cuyahoga County Public Library system, which is ranked Number 1 in the nation.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

THEREFORE, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of a majority of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
