AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF COOK PAVING, FOR THE 2009 ROAD MAINTENANCE PROGRAM AS THE LOWEST AND BEST BID, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton has advertised for bids for the 2009 Road Maintenance Program; and

WHEREAS: It has been determined that the bid of Cook Paving for partial depth joint repairs-concrete and asphalt, and pavement planing is the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to accept this bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The bid of Cook Paving for partial depth joint repairs-concrete and asphalt, and pavement planing is hereby accepted as the lowest and best bid as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Cook Paving, in a form approved by the Law Director.

Section 3. The Service Director is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to Cook Paving, and all certified checks and bonds are hereby authorized to be returned to the unsuccessful bidders.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for the above equipment, material, and/or services for the 2009 Road Maintenance Program in the City of North Royalton.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
