AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF VULCAN, INC. FOR A HIGH INTENSITY PRISMATIC SIGN SUPPLY PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$48,819.31 AS THE LOWEST AND BEST BID, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton has advertised for bids for a High Intensity Prismatic Sign Supply Program; and

WHEREAS: It has been determined that the bid of Vulcan, Inc. in the amount of \$48,819.31 is the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to accept this bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:

Section 1. The bid of Vulcan, Inc. for a High Intensity Prismatic Sign Supply Program in the amount of \$48,819.31 is hereby accepted as the lowest and best bid as set forth in Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Vulcan, Inc. in a form approved by the Law Director.

Section 3. The Service Director is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to Vulcan, Inc., and all certified checks and bid bonds are hereby authorized to be returned to the unsuccessful bidders.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for the performance of this work for the North Royalton Service Department.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
