ORDINANCE NO. 10-72

INTRODUCED BY: Mayor Stefanik

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A REOPENER AGREEMENT WITH AMERICAN FEDERATION OF STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, OHIO COUNCIL 8, AND LOCAL 3410 FOR CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE WASTEWATER AND SERVICE DEPARTMENTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: Council and the Administration have conducted negotiations with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Ohio Council 8, and Local 3410 as the bargaining representative for certain members of the Wastewater and Service Departments; and

WHEREAS: Such negotiations have provided a tentative agreement between the parties; and

WHEREAS: Such negotiations have also provided for a Reopener Agreement in the event that the bargaining units covering the employees in the Police and Fire Departments received a salary increase or variance from the agreed upon health care insurance employee cost plan; and

WHEREAS: Council and the Administration have reviewed said agreement and do desire to ratify and adopt same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a Reopener Agreement with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Ohio Council 8, and Local 3410 on behalf of certain members of the Wastewater and Service Departments pursuant to terms and conditions approved by the Law Director and substantially similar to a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were passed in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such actions were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that in order to facilitate payment of compensation to certain employees of the city, the foregoing Ordinance is required at the earliest possible time.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
